You visit a toy shop to buy a teddy bear for your baby sister, you have £10 to spend. The teddy bear costs £10, but has a number of offers available. Which one is the best value for money?

Buy one get one half price Buy one get one free 40% off

It's a hot summers day, you and your three friends, decide to buy some ice-creams.
Which offer represents the best value for money? You have £5 to spend. Each ice-cream costs £1.00.

Buy one get one half price Buy 4 ice-creams get 30% off

Special offer: £3.50 for 4 ice-creams

You have decided to go to the theme park for the day with your brother / sister, you have £5 each to spend on the rides, all rides are 2.50p per go.

Three rides for the price of two

5 Ride pass for £8

Special offer: 30% off all rides

Answers: 1. Buying a multipack (45p per packet); **2**. 10% off for 12 months; **3**. Buy one get one free would give you two teddies at £5 per teddy but if you only need one teddy then the best value is 40% off, or £6 for a single teddy; **4**. Buy 4 ice-creams, get 30% off; **5**. 3 rides for the price of 2 would give each of you 3 rides for your five pounds (£1.67 per ride) but technically the cheaper cost per ride is the 5 ride pass costing £1.60 per ride but one of you would only get two rides.

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
